Keith Rennolls has passed some information on to me about your new indoor group CRaw. He tells me that you require information about BTCV affiliation and insurance which I enclose.

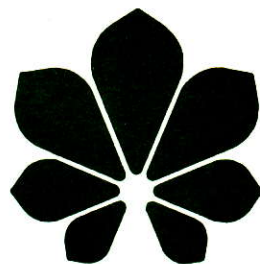
